Three Arrest Made in Animal Cruelty Case

Troup County, Ga. December 2, 2020 – On December 2, 2020, at approximately 10:00 a.m., The Troup County Marshal's Office arrested three people for animal cruelty in which two dogs were recovered from a home located at 116 Southern Pine Drive.

According to reports, On December 1, 2020, The Troup County Sheriff's Department was in the area issuing arrested warrants when they noticed two dogs in poor condition. Based on their observation, the Troup County Sheriff's Office notified the Troup County Marshal's Office of the incident.

Shortly after the Troup County Marshal's Office conducted an investigation, it was determined that the dogs were unhealthy and living in unsanitary conditions.

The three suspects were arrested and transported to the Troup County Jail and charged with Cruelty to Animals (misdemeanor).

The two dogs received treatment from a local veterinarian; the animals are currently in the City Of LaGrange Animal Shelter's custody, where they will be appropriately cared for.

"We take animal cruelty very seriously, and we will not tolerate it," said County Manager Eric Mosley.
