County Continues Road Resurfacing Project

Troup County, Ga. October 15, 2019 – Troup County Roads and Engineering is continuing progress on a countywide road resurfacing project to restore surface conditions on County roadways.

The project began in late spring of 2019 and is being funded through Special Purpose Local Option Sales Tax (SPLOST) funding and Georgia Department of Transportation Local Maintenance and Improvement Grant (GDOT LMIG) funding. The county is expecting to resurface a total of 47 miles on thirty-two roads in Troup County by late fall/early winter, weather permitting. Currently, 16 miles of roadways in Troup County have already been resurfaced this year, including Industrial Drive, Johnson Road, Alverson Road, East Hopson Road, West Hopson Road, South Bolee Road, Woodard Road, Gates Road, and Mountville Hogansville Road.

The road resurfacing project coincides with several other ongoing projects for the Roads and Engineering department, including the South Thompson Road bridge replacement project, which is expected to conclude by early 2020, weather permitting. The department is also making progress on the upgrading, widening, and paving of Jim Perry Road; a storm drainage culvert replacement on Leathe Drive; various countywide unpaved road maintenance; and road repair requests previously delayed due to the overwhelming emergency road repair priorities caused by the April 2019 flooding event, which damaged thirteen county roads.

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
