Road Closures Due to Flooding and Severe Weather

Troup County, Ga. April 19, 2019 – The Troup County Roads and Engineering Department has had confirmed reports of extensive localized flooding and fallen trees that have caused numerous road closures due to the latest severe weather and excessive rain.

At this time, Troup County has had confirmed road closures on all of the following roads due to flooding:

- Hunt Road
- Murphy Road
- Perry Mill Road at Crawford Creek
- Laurel Lane
- Floyd Road at Mountain Laurel
- Oak Grove Road
- Burgess Road
- Leisure Circle
- Leisure Lane
- Autumn Trail
- John Lovelace Road near 699
- Old Chipley Road near 1995
- Flat Shoals Church Road near 503
- Wright Road
- Salem Chipley Road at Turkey Creek
- Finney Road at Polecat Creek
- Bill Taylor Road between 505 and 646
- South Thompson Bridge
- New Franklin Road near Arby's
- Northwoods Drive at Bailey Way
- North Davis Road near Gardner Newman Middle School
- Ford Drive near 120

Portions of roadways along Wright Road and Bill Taylor Road have completely washed out and are impassable until further notice. The County urges the public to find an alternate route at this time.

There have also been confirmed road closures due to fallen trees on the following roads:

- Salem Road
- Rock Mills Road near Antioch Road
- Plymouth Drive near 120
- SR54 at Glover Road

The Troup County Roads and Engineering Department, along with the Troup County Sheriff's Office, are working diligently to assess current road conditions, clear road debris, and reopen roadway travel as quickly as possible. In addition, our Troup County E-911 Department, Troup County Sheriff's Office, Troup County Fire Department and our devoted volunteers, and Troup County Roads and Engineering Department have worked tirelessly throughout the early morning hours to assist citizens in the community with emergency calls and crisis reports due to the excessive roadway damage. The County urges the public to remain cautious on the roadways throughout the weekend and to continue to report any detected roadway damage and to remain alert to standing water on roadways.
