Troup County Clean-up Initiative Planned

The Troup County Board of Commissioners has announced an initiative to clean up the community of Troup County. The project “Troup County Clean-up Initiative” is a long-term commitment by Troup County’s officials and concerned citizens working toward neighborhoods that are safe, clean, and cared for places to live. It is hoped that this initiative, at the very least, will bring homes and businesses into compliance with the basic County and State ordinances. The County has expressed its commitment to maintain a high level of enforcement activity in Troup County. This includes revisiting areas as well as focusing attention in new areas. Whether you rent or own, the county would like to ensure that residents take care of their property to avoid code violations before County code enforcement intervention becomes necessary.

Our community is a mixture of individuals, some who have respect for their community and take care of their homes and commercial properties, and some who simply do not. It’s no secret that this community has a number of abandoned homes, businesses, and empty lots. Many of the current violations are for illegal signage, outside storage, and junk vehicles. The plan includes allowing the residents and businesses that are non-compliant an opportunity to comply, but enforcement will be prompt to those who do not.

“If we all pitch in to help, we can help keep Troup County beautiful” said Patrick Crews, Chairman of the Troup County Board of Commissioners. If we are to remain a great community, we will need everyone to “pitch in”.
